3.	Review		
1.		Teachers will be confident to teach a variety of different sports and have the ability to differentiate the skills according to ability. Several teachers attended a variety of different sports CPD offered through the cluster i.e. gymnastics, tri-golf, Hi- 5 netball and rugby. In addition, there was a twilight dance CPD course run for staff during a weekly staff meeting. Team teaching took place with dance from years 1 – 6 and a brief period of rugby in years 4 and 6. Fulham FC provided an opportunity for team teaching in Lime Class year 3.	
2.		PE coordinator will be provided with time to organise clubs and competitions as well as liaise with sports specialists. This year the PE Coordinator has made links with Fulham FC, Premiere Stars and Richard Challoner High School to introduce new clubs and the opportunity to be invited to new sporting competitions/training sessions. Our school also had the great opportunity to have the Premier League trophy in our school for an assembly and photo opportunities with the children (one of only a few schools in the entire country).	
3.		Children will be provided with an opportunity to develop their confidence and self-esteem through increased opportunities for outdoor learning and Forest School sessions. Forest Schools have run for approximately 75 children taken from reception and years 5 & 6. Moving forward we will be measuring the impact that these sessions are having on their confidence and self-esteem.	

4.		<p>Specialised instructors and coaches will be hired to provide high level instruction and inspire teachers for future teaching sessions. A rugby and dance instructor has been hired to teach a series of lessons to different year groups: rugby Aut 2 (Y4) spring 1 (Y2), dance aut 2 (Y6), spring 1 (Y3), spring 2 (Y4), summer 1 (Y1) and summer 2 (Y2).</p>
5.		<p>Children will have more opportunities for competitive play within the school day. A four-team football division was created to allow our year 5/6 boys and girls football teams to train and play together. This year's sports day tried to incorporate new elements of competition with a semi and final race being run for girls and boys in each class of the 100m sprint. In the run up to sports day, relay teams from similar year groups were competing against the opposite class. Long distance races were also held in class vs class competitions.</p>
6.		<p>Children will have more opportunities to compete in inter-school events across the borough. Green Lane's participation in inter-school events rose from 24th place in the borough in 2015 – 2016 to 17th in the borough in 2016 – 2017. We also qualified for the Silver School Games Mark this year.</p>
7.		<p>Children will have access to an increased number of sports clubs beyond the school day. Clubs for the 3 terms have been recorded above and the number of participants has been indicated. The number of clubs has continued to increase on a termly basis.</p>
8.		<p>There will be a greater link between support and parents/carers to benefit from their specialisations and talents in sports. As the year progressed we went from strength to strength and developed our running, rugby and net ball clubs which are all run by volunteering parents. Children in dance and gymnastics club had an opportunity to showcase their talents at the summer fair in centre ring demonstrations.</p>
9.		<p>Pupils will develop healthy lifestyles. Because the profile of sport has been raised at Green Lane and the number of clubs and events has increased so has the interest in participating in sports and fostering a healthy lifestyle. The introduction of the Daily Mile continues to a daily feature in classes from reception through to year 6.</p>
10.		<p>Year 6 Sport Leaders will have an increasing role in assisting with sport activities at least 1 x per week on KS1 playground and LKS1 break times. The pupil leaders supported the organisation and upkeep of equipment, provided student led sporting activities regularly for KS1 at lunch and helped with the set up and running of Sports Day.</p>
