Pupil Premium Policy

Introduction

The Pupil Premium was introduced by the Government in April 2011, and is paid by means of a specific grant based on school census figures for disadvantaged children. The Pupil Premium is additional to main school funding.

Nationally, students in receipt of Pupil Premium funding achieve less well than their peers. It is the school's experience that disadvantaged students often experience less parental support at home and less access to extra-curricular opportunities.

A premium has also been introduced for children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces. This Service Premium is designed to address the emotional and social well-being of these pupils.

Policy statement

It is the policy of Green Lane Primary and Nursery School (GLPNS) that the Pupil Premium will be used by the school to address underlying inequalities between children, removing barriers to access and opportunities with the aim of achieving better outcomes for all.

Principle

There is a gap, nationally, between the attainment of students eligible for Pupil Premium support and those who are not eligible.

The School aims to raise the aspirations of all of our pupils.

Procedures

The School will publish online an annual strategy for how the Pupil Premium funding will be spent. The impact of that strategy will be reviewed termly by the leadership team and the Governing Body to reflect the changing needs of the student body.

The School will publish online information regarding the impact of the Pupil Premium funding spend in the previous year(s).

Guidance

The expenditure of Pupil Premium funding is at the discretion of the school only. It may not be used to fund the day to day running of the school.
